

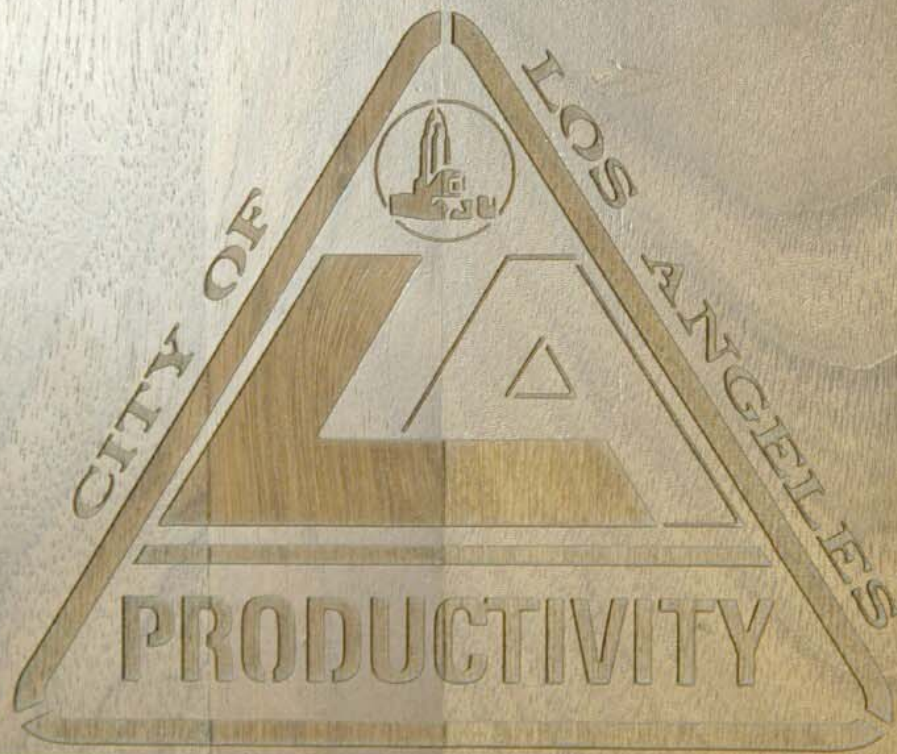



CITATION:

For meritorious service in defense of the Embassy of the United States of America in San Salvador from 16 May 1979 to 31 January 1980. During this period, the Government of El Salvador underwent a revolutionary change which brought numerous violent demonstrations and harassment by local mobs and terrorists against the Embassy Compound. The Marine Security Guard Detachment was not only tasked with the protection of classified material and property but, due to the highly deteriorating political situation and escalating terrorism, were also utilized in perimeter defensive roles. While performing this defensive role on 30 October 1979, the Embassy Compound was attacked by 150-200 armed hostile demonstrators brandishing pistols, rifles, and sub-machine guns. Despite the fact that the Marines were under intensive hostile fire and that two Marines were wounded, they kept their calm and successfully repulsed the attackers through the use of sizable quantities of tear gas. Through the Marine Security Guard's actions, the Compound remained secure and no American or Foreign National lives were lost on the Compound. Performing under the most difficult and demanding situation, the members of the Detachment maintained a dignified and highly professional attitude that was a calming effect to all who observed them. By their unmatched display of courage, perseverance, and unrelenting dedication to duty, the personnel of the Marine Security Guard Detachment, San Salvador reflected credit upon themselves and upheld the highest traditions of the Marine Corps and the United States Naval Service.


